MYTHS VS FACTS

MYTH

A menthol ban will increase the potential for unjustly criminalizing African Americans.

The FDA is trying to take away personal freedom

A menthol ban could create a illegal market

There more pressing issues facing the Black community.

FACT

- A menthol ban would prohibit people from manufacturing, distributing and selling menthols, not possessing them.
- > FDA regulates food, drugs & products that pose a threat to public health & safety.

 They do not regulate personal choices
- In places where a ban exists, data shows no likelihood of the illicit trade of menthol cigarettes
- Tobacco related illness kills more African Americans than murders, suicides, HIV and are accidents combined.
